

WEBELOS MEETING SCHEDULE

First meeting - August –Meet at the a location with a Flag pole

Work on Citizen Pin

2 scouts carry the Flag as God Bless America Plays. Raise Flag and Say Pledge of Allegiance and say its meaning.

Talk how we raise and lower the flag.

Have the two scouts lower the flag and fold it as one of the leaders reads “Why our

2 new scouts carry the flag and raise it to the Star Spangled Banner and they tell about it.

Talk how the flag is displayed on the wall, on the stage and in a parade. Field of blue always on the left. Flag is always on the right of the speaker. In a parade, hold higher and in the middle of three flags or to the right of the other flag. It carried with another country flag then they are same size and height and held equal.

Give the scouts some paper and art supplies. Have them draw to see what flag they are to draw. Art requirement #3. When done have them talk about there flag from the Webelos book

Have the 2 scouts lower the flag to the song TAPS. As they fold it, a leader will read the beginning

Last two scouts raise the flag and read Remember ME?

Talk about respecting the flag.

- Always remove your hat unless it is part of your uniform.

- When you approach a flag ceremony STOP and participate where you are.

- When in uniform give the scouting salute, otherwise put your hand on your heart.

- Salute the flag while it is being hoisted and lowered.

- Salute when you pass the flag or when the flag passes you in a parade.

- Salute the flag as long as the flag is traveling, down the pole or down the isle.

- Fly the flag only when weather permits.

- If flown at night, place a spotlight on it, otherwise take it down at night.

- Fly the flag especially for the following days. New Years Day, Martin Luther King Day, President Day, Flag Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Veteran Day, Thanksgiving Day and other on page 152.

- On Memorial Day (last Monday in May) fly half staff until noon, full staff to sunset.

- When the flag is worn beyond repair, burn it thoroughly, respectfully and completely in a blazing fire. There are several ceremonies and ways to do it. Not just anyone should burn the flag.

- Let the boys decide which type of ceremony they want to perform at the Pack meeting.

Webelos Den Meetings

1st September meeting- Start working on Athlete and Fitness Pins

Open with Pledge of Allegiance

What does Webelos means - We'll Be loyal Scouts

As a Webelo you can wear the blue or the tan shirt. The tan shirt has eplapes and you will need to get the blue ones. When you become a boy scout then will wear red.

When do you wear your uniform? To den and pack meetings, when traveling to scouting activities, when do service projects, during the national fundraiser like popcorn, during scouting Anniversary week in February, to school the day of den or pack meetings, to church on Scout Sunday.

When do you NOT wear your uniform? When you are involved in any distinctly political activity, appearing on the stage professionally, when you are participating in demonstrations not authorized by the Boy Scouts of America, and when you are doing a pack or den fundraiser.

Athlete #4 Warm up exercises.

Athlete #5 Curl ups, pull ups, push-ups, standing long jump, ¼-mile run/walk and vertical jump.

Run to streetlight and back. Do touch backs on driveway. Do jumping jacks. Run to street light and back again. Check hear rate and find your target heart rate.

Cool down and stretch.

Explain reasons for warming up and cooling down before and after you exercise.

Do at home over the next few weeks -- Athlete #1, Fitness #1,3,4, & 2 or 8.

Work on Physical Fitness Pin requirements. #2,4 and 7 will be done in den meetings. You will need to do 2 more.

Work on the Faith requirements for the Webelos Badge and #1.

Work on Family Member and Traveler at Home

Develop a list of jobs you can do at home and chart your progress for one week.

Take pictures of everything you do at den meetings, pack meetings and at home while working on your requirements. Put these in a scrapbook. Add any of your art projects that you do also. We will display these at Blue and Gold. I will e-mail pictures that I take to you and you can print the ones that you want for you scrapbook. Fill free to do the same with the ones you take.

Close with the Friendship circle.

2nd September meeting --

Open with Pledge of Allegiance

Learn scout sign, handshake and salute.

Do Scout Oath puzzle then take pieces away until they have learned the Oath.

Go over Athlete requirements 2 & 3 and Fitness 5,6 & 7

Do warm up exercises and then curl ups, pull-ups, push-ups, standing long jump, ¼-mile run/walk and vertical jump.

If time allows have them draw the food pyramid and talk about the Fitness 3 & 4 requirements to do done at home. Maybe have them do a menu for the Webelos Woods campout. Have them turn them in and we will create and menu from them. They will then be given back for them to put in their scrapbooks.

Close with the Friendship Circle

1st October meeting - Open with the Pledge of Allegiance and the Scout Oath

Learn the Scout Motto and Sloan

Who are the President, Vice President, Governor of Kansas and the Mayors of Wichita and Goddard?

Read the following and make a poster showing things that you can do to be a good citizen.

What are our Rights and Duties of a citizen? Pg 155 and 156

What makes a good citizen pg 159

Why we have laws pg 160 & 161

What are some organizations that help other people?

Pass out America's Symbols Quiz, Do you know you state quiz, Do you know you Flag quiz, and How to become a Citizen quiz.

Do they warm up exercises

Curl ups, pull-ups, push ups, standing long jump, ¼-mile run/walk and vertical jump.

Close with Friendship circle

2nd October meeting - Finish 30-day work out

Open with Pledge of Allegiance and Scout Oath

Review the motto and slogan.

Learn the Scout Law

Warm up

Do Obstacle course

Curl ups, pull-ups, push ups, standing long jump, ¼-mile run/walk and vertical jump.

Close with Friendship Circle and Scout Law

3rd October meeting

Open with Pledge of Allegiance and Scout Oath

Read and go over the Outdoor Code

Work on Leave No Trace award. Pledge on Pg 72. Make a mobile to illustrate the Leave No Trace guidelines. Take to the Pack meeting.

Talk about Webelos Woods. Menu, tent arrangements and travel arrangements.

Fuse and whip ends of rope. Set up tent or dining fly using taut line.

Close with friendship circle and Scout Law

If you have done your homework this should complete the Athlete, Fitness, and Citizen Pin. The Physical Fitness Belt Loop and Pin, Citizenship Belt Loop, and the WEBELOS BADGE!!!!!!!!!!

1st November meeting Saturday - Field Trip Pawnee Prairie Park or the Great Plains Nature Center.

Take and 3 mile hike and finish the Naturalist pin.

2nd November meeting –

Open with Pledge Allegiance and Scout Oath

Work on Skit or Puppet play for entertainment at the Pack meeting. Showman requirement. Possibly something to do with Popcorn sales.

Close with Friendship circle and Scout Law

3rd Saturday or Friday night November meeting -- Field Trip

Museum of National History - Maybe spend the night.

4th November meeting Saturday meet to practice Entertainment for Pack meeting.

Pack meeting award - Naturalist Pin

1st December meeting

Open with Pledge of Allegiance and Scout Oath

Finish Art Pin and Artist Belt Loop and Pin. Make a Piñata to break at next den meeting, Craftsman requirement. 1 out of 4

Close with the Friendship circle and Scout Law

2nd December meeting

Open with Pledge of Allegiance and Scout Oath

Work on Craftsman. Talk of Tools. Make bird feeders. Also make some with pinecones and peanut butter.

Break Piñata

Close with friendship circle and Scout Law

Awards for the December Pack meeting - Art Pin, Artist Belt Loop and Pin

1st January meeting

Open with Pledge of Allegiance and Scout Oath

Readyman – ask Tana to come and help complete. #1,2,3,4,5,6,7,12,14

Close with Friendship circle and Scout Law

2nd January meeting

Open with Pledge of Allegiance and Scout Oath

Work on Scholar - #12, #10 and #8 (Chess Belt Loop) - #13, 2 & 3 to be done at home.

Close with Friendship circle and Scout Law

1st February meeting

Open with Pledge of Allegiance and Scout Oath

Work on Communicator #4 and #16. #11,12,13,14,&15 done at home. Copy pages from requirement 12 and make a poster with them. Bring them to den meeting to share.

Have someone from another country that has gotten his or her Naturalization citizenship. This completes the Language and Culture Belt Loop.

Close in the friendship circle and Scout Law.

2nd February meeting

Open with Pledge of Allegiance and Scout Oath

Finnish Forester - #1,5,7

Work on Leatherwork Kit – Craftsman 2 out of 4

Close in Friendship circle and Scout Law

1st March meeting

Open with Pledge of Allegiance and Scout Oath

Make a wood shelf to display pinewood derby car or award on. Craftsman # 2 & 3

Close with Friendship Circle and Scout Law

2nd March meeting

Open with Pledge of Allegiance and Scout Oath

Work on puppet or one act play for entertainment at pack meeting.

Close with friendship circle and Scout Law

1st April meeting

Open with Pledge of Allegiance and Scout Oath

Engineer - #2, #7, (bring wood blocks and paper to build bridges), #9 (catapult kit), #10 Math Loop#3. # 1 and #2 of math loop done at home.

Close with Friendship circle and Scout Law

2nd April meeting

Visit and construction site and talk to an engineer

3rd April meeting

Open with Pledge of Allegiance and Scout Oath

Handyman - # 2,5,6,7,8,10

Close with Friendship circle and Scout Law

1st May meeting – Saturday

Field trip to complete Geologist pin

2nd May meeting

Open with Pledge of Allegiance and Scout Oath

See if Mr. Lou Science teacher from Discovery can come and help complete Scientist # 1,2,3,4 and the Science Loop.

Close with Friendship Circle and Scout Law

3rd May meeting –

Open with Pledge of Allegiance and Scout Oath

Finish Scientist pin # 5,10,11 &12

Close with Friendship circle and Scout Law

All pins should be completed or pretty close to being completed. You may need to do a couple of craftsman projects at home or next fall. Sportsman can be done at home or next fall.

Next fall from September to January or February work on Boy Scout transitions. Pick a Patrol leader and let him plan a den meeting. Let him conduct it also. He then picks another scout to be patrol leader and so forth until everyone has had a chance to plan and conduct a meeting. Some of the things they could do at the meetings are pick a patrol name, make a patrol flag and make up a patrol yell. Plan campouts and activities and work on cooking outdoors.

In October campout with the Troop at Lake Afton.

Need to attend a Troop meeting either in the spring or in the fall to complete the Arrow of Light

Attend the high school musical or Out of the Blue Play to complete Showman.
